


Houston is ranked #2 of the 125 largest US cities for light pollution exposure risks to nocturnally migrating birds

The Dallas-Fort Worth metro area is ranked #3 of the 125 largest US cities for light pollution exposure risks to nocturnally migrating birds













Spring Migration March 1 - June 15 1 of every 3 birds migrating through the U.S. in Spring passes through Texas

Fall Migration August 15 - November 30 1 of every 4 birds migrating through the U.S. in Fall passes through Texas

Peak Migration Spring: April 22 - May 12 Fall: September 5 - October 29





Live bird migration maps that show where migration is occurring in real-time





Search with our local migration alert tool to determine whether birds are passing overhead near your city tonight!

BirdCast provides live and local bird migration alerts throughout the continental US by employing realanalysis of bird migration traffic as detected by radar. You can use this tool to determine whether birds migrating in your area tonight in low, medium, or high densities. Find your area among the featured citi in the drop down menu or using the search bar! Besides providing curious birders information on local migration and where and when to go birding, these alerts serve an important conservation need. They provide timely information about nights of high intensity migration (otherwise referred to as peak migration), only a handful of which occur throughout a given season. This allows effective targeting of the




BUILDING COLLISION STUDY

Collected birds are sent to the Biodiversity Research and Teaching Collections at Texas A&M University.





GET INVOLVED! Guidelines for EVERYONE:




Do not use landscape lighting to light up trees or gardens where birds may be resting.

For essential lights (like security lighting) use the following dark skies friendly lighting practices:

- Aim lights down
- Use lighting shields to direct light downwards and to avoid light shining into the sky or trees
- Use motion detectors and sensors so lights are only on when you need them
- Close blinds at night to reduce the amount of light being emitted from windows
