Our Values: • Comunidad

We are a comunidad that comes together to cultivate the compassion, knowledge, and power needed to make transformational change by forging relationships and sharing resources. Our connection to one another helps us break down intersectional and systemic barriers, increasing the potency of our advocacy. Our power increases when we engage our community members, grow the movement, and learn from the experience and knowledge of others. We build unity through community.





Justice

We assert that the communities suffering the most from environmental degradation and the climate crisis are those who have done the least to cause these problems. As members of these communities, we have been historically excluded, segregated, and disproportionately subjected to pollutants by inequitable design and policy. We are committed to inclusion, unity, and equitable design and policy to undo these injustices. We are an organization that confronts injustices by intentionally centering the diverse voices and solutions from the frontlines. We seek to mitigate pollution burdens in our communities and expand communities' access to environmental amenities. The fight for environmental liberation is a fight for justice.

Culture

Environmental stewardship is part of our cultural heritage. Outdoor activities and appreciating nature unite us and connect us to our deeply rooted traditions. By rooting our actions in the stories, music, art, and practices passed down by our ancestors, we honor and celebrate our rich culture as a source of resilience and advocacy for environmental, conservation, and climate justice. We continue the work of movements that came before us, defending our autonomy, building upon our cultural assets, celebrating our identity, and honoring our heritage.





Collective Action

We stand together for transformative change and activate to overcome institutionalized racism, corrupt political systems, and the outsized influence of polluting industries. We believe that joyful, creative, and sustained collective action can attract significant participation, strengthen our political position, and win policy changes across every level of government.

Accountability

We honor our authentic relationships through the integrity of our shared work and culture. We strive to earn and maintain the trust of our members, allies, stakeholders, and staff through transparent organizational practices and open dialogue. We are accountable to each other, those impacted by our work, and the groups with whom we collaborate. Expand our Current and Future State Programs, Support Work in Latin America & the Caribbean, and Increase our Advocacy and Political Power

- GreenLatinos will effect significant change on the local, state, regional, and federal levels by growing our current state programs (CO, CA, NM, IL, TX) and expanding to additional states, with robust internal and external alignment, collaboration, and evaluation.
- GreenLatinos will engage more intentionally in influencing global climate, conservation, and environmental frameworks. We will develop the knowledge, power, and relationships necessary to increase support for Latin American and Caribbean-based environmental, conservation, and climate justice leaders, organizations, and issues, thereby enhancing our positive influence on international conventions, treaties, and agendas.

Programs, Support Work in Latin America & the Caribbean, and Increase our Advocacy and Political Power, cont.

- GreenLatinos will establish a 501(c)4 advocacy entity and a Political Action Committee (PAC) to grow and strengthen the advocacy and political influence of the Latino environmental and conservation community impacted by these issues.
- GreenLatinos will strengthen our strategic positioning and partnerships, counter
 misinformation, and utilize advanced advocacy and communications tools and strategies
 to better advocate for policies aligned with the Latino Climate Justice Framework, while
 defending key science-based bedrock environmental laws and regulations.



2. Build, Support, and Mobilize the Membership Community

- GreenLatinos will utilize local and state in-person and virtual convenings to grow and connect our membership, calibrate our state and local policy priorities, and increase the sharing of information, resources, and power in our communities.
- GreenLatinos will increase our members' participation and communication by improving the organizational support, professional development resources, and opportunities we make available to them.
- GreenLatinos will develop our future members by launching our own volunteer, internship/fellowship, and leadership programs.
- GreenLatinos will promote collective activism and support the defense of frontline advocates facing civil and human rights challenges.

- GreenLatinos will amplify the work in our communities by highlighting our members' campaign successes, better showcasing our organizational impact, and positioning staff as experts in the media. This increased profile will help to secure resources for the campaigns in our network.
- GreenLatinos will strengthen our operations and systems, bolster our security, and tighten employment practices while fostering a bold, creative, joyful, and effective work culture.
- GreenLatinos will launch a mission-aligned social enterprise that embeds a social entrepreneurship model into its operations by marketing innovative services, products, and projects designed to address environmental challenges facing our communities.
